

Preface

Within the boundaries of McDonough County, Illinois are more than a hundred cemeteries and gravesites ranging in size from a single burial site to the expansive Oakwood Cemetery at Macomb. Within these cemeteries are the remains of an estimated 40,000 individuals who have died since the first settler arrived here over 150 years ago. Graves of countless others are scattered over the countryside of McDonough County; but, exact sites of many of these resting places are no longer known for various reasons. During the early days of this county, there were obviously no central burial grounds; thus, a pioneer family having the misfortune of losing one of it's members placed the deceased in a grave on a family homestead and erected a makeshift marker. A number of these family burial grounds later became public cemeteries, however, many of the grave sites soon became "lost". Crude wooden markers or a hand engraved stone soon succumbed to the elements and were never replaced; scores of families moved further west after staying in this area only a short time and the gravesites of their loved ones shortly became insignificant mounds of earth; a number of families passing through this vicinity suffered individual losses. A prime example of the latter is contained in a history of Bethel Township. In 1830, four children of an emigrant family died while enroute through McDonough County. They were buried near their places of death which occurred about two miles southwest of Fandon. All traces of those graves have long been gone. During the summer of 1834, a widow lady died at her home in northern Tennessee Township. Her coffin of dressed walnut lumber was built by a local cabinet maker and she was buried in the timber near her home. Within a few years, no evidence remained to indicate the presence of her final resting place. A family who created an excellent farm from the prairies a few miles north of Macomb, maintained a fenced family burial site for several years. This cemetery contained the graves of about 12 former family members. During the early 1900's, the farm changed ownership. Shortly thereafter, the new owner removed all the stones, took down the fence, and this graveyard became part of a cornfield. These are only three of the countless incidents involving the total disappearance of burial sites. At this time, it is impossible to determine the locations of hundreds of individual's graves in this county.

Vandalism is responsible for the destruction of many grave stones. Countless markers have been partially or totally destroyed. Inscriptions have been obliterated by shotgun blasts, stones have been broken into dozens of pieces, and some markers have been entirely removed from their original locations.

While weather-wear and vandalism accounts for most of the destruction of individual tombstones, neglect is directly responsible for the eventual deterioration of graveyards. Several local cemeteries have had no protective fencing for a number of years and the grounds have become grazing land for livestock. Groundhogs and other burrowing animals have undermined large portions of various cemeteries. Some areas are nearly invisible because of massive growths of weeds and brush. Stones have fallen, broken, and become completely covered with soil and debris.

The overall conditions of our county cemeteries is a pathetic case. While some grounds are well maintained, or at least partially kept-up by various families, many have been totally forgotten. This situation is appalling and should never have come about. Apparently, lack of time, expense, and most of all regard has brought about the present-day poor conditions of many of our rural cemeteries.

Genealogical notes accompanying the various cemetery listings were prepared from a wide variety of sources including: Local area history books and atlases; newspaper files; county, state, and federal archives; family histories. These notes were collected at random from readily available sources and little, or no attempts were made to search for material for more complete genealogies. These notes are presented only for the purposes of identification and/or clarification.

Every attempt has been made to present complete and accurate information. Readers will find errors and omissions. Others will not agree with portions of my findings; however, no information contained herein is based solely on assumption or guesswork. It must be remembered that this information has been prepared for use only as a tool for further research and that nothing must be taken as final and absolute.

The larger cemeteries contained in these volumes are accompanied by grave location charts. These charts in no way are intended to represent any professionally prepared plat or survey that may exist. Their preparation and presentation are solely for general location purposes.

When copying inscriptions from grave markers, it is sometimes impossible to read some portions of the engraving. Names, dates, ages, etc. that were found to be unclear or totally missing are indicated by the use of question marks or dashes, i.e., SPICER, James T., infant son of ?J.B. & S.J.?; d. ----; age ----. The letters or numbers enclosed in parenthesis following the inscription, indicate general location as indicated on the accompanying chart.








Areas covered by volumes I - XVII






Argyle Cemetery

Location: Hire township, SW $\frac{1}{4}$, section 36; about two miles north-west of Colchester.

Remarks: The Cumberland Presbyterian Church of Argyle was originally organized in the southwestern part of Emmet township and held first meetings in 1834. First known as Bersheba Church, the congregation met at or near the original site until 1854, when it was transferred to its present location. The church building was erected in 1854 and was used for several years by both Baptists and Cumberland Presbyterians.

At the present, the church and adjoining cemetery lie on a 2-3 acre tract. The grounds are completely fenced and are regularly maintained. A number of the older stones are badly weather-worn; some have been broken. Several unreadable field-stones were located, especially in the south part.



Their daughter, Mary, was born in Virginia in 1785, later married John McCord and lived in Overton County, Tennessee before moving to Illinois.)

ATKINSON: Simeon Atkinson and Mrs. Francis Yard were married in this county on July 14, 1842. 1850 census NO# 264--ATKINSON, Simeon, 48, farmer, b. England; Frances, 45, b. England; Mary, 15, England; John W., 13, b. England; Amanda, 11, b. England; Levi, 8, b. Ill.; Wm. H., 6, b. Ill.; James R., 2, b. Ill.; Simeon, 2 mos., b. Ill.; YARD, Thomas, 19, farmer, b. Conn.; YARD, Mary F., 17, b. Ill.; WARREN, George, 22, farm laborer, Ohio.

Louis; lived on section 31, NE $\frac{1}{4}$, Emmet township; owned 200A here and 40A in NW $\frac{1}{4}$, section 31; was of English descent and parents were natives of England; Louis was born in this county in 1842 and lived on the homestead with his parents; married Feb 11, 1866 to Maria J. Martin, dau of George Martin, who settled in this county in 1850 and later, in 1868, moved to Henry Co., Mo.; Atkinsons had 9 children--7 living in 1885; Sarah Frances, Amos S., Wm. C., Ira L., Ora C., Clara, and Thomas J.; Alta M. and Cora Jane died previous to 1885. NOTE: 1871 Atlas indicates Francis (or Frances) Atkinson as owner of the Emmet township property.

BAYLESS: Jefferson Bayless, native of Tenn., born in Knox County, Tenn. May 27, 1827; the son of Isaac and Betsey Ann (Sumter) Bayless; they both died in Tenn. and were buried in Knox Co.; Jefferson was raised in Tenn. and married Luartha Ledgerwood, a native of Tenn.; they were married in May, 1851; *she died Apr 1856 and was buried in Atkinson Cemetery on section 31, Emmet township. (*Tombstone inscription says she died Jan 8, 1857.) They had one child, Isaac. Jefferson remarried in Tenn on Sep 28, 1858 to C. S. Lucy, a daughter of Wm. and Eveline Lucy; they had the following children--Eva, married E. Richardson and moved to Nebr.; Bessie A.; Jennie H.; Willie L.; Ida M.; Frederick B.; John H.; and Ray M. Jefferson settled on section 19, Emmet township and bought 40A; he later owned a total of 160A in this area.

William W.; born in Overton Co., Tenn. on Feb 12, 1809; lived there till the fall of 1829; moved with family to Morgan Co., Ill. and there 2 years; then he and his father moved to this county in 1832 and Wm. then returned to Tenn. where he married Louisa Scantlin on Nov 1, 1832; she was a native of Jackson Co., Tenn.; they lived there 2 years and returned to this county and lived here till the spring of 1849 and moved to Nauvoo; there about 2 years and back to this county; in the spring of 1878 moved to Kan. and 1st wife died there in the fall of 1878; Wm. then returned to this State and lived in Franklin county; married there to Lucretia Mulkey; lived there a

short time; 2nd wife died within a year of marriage; Wm. returned to this county in the spring of ???? and lived here till his death on Jul 20, 1884 at age 75 years.

John A. F.; born in Emmet township on section 30, Mar 14, 1844; was the 2nd son of Wm. and Louisa (Scantlin) McCord; moved to Idaho at age 20 in search of gold; returned after short time; farmer here and dug coal in the winter; married on Nov 8, 1866 to Sarah J. McGee, a native of Hancock county; she was a daughter of Wm. McGee who died when his daughter was very young; McCord lived in Hire township for 5 years on section 25; bought 40A on section 36 in 1872; owned 76A at home place and 25A of timber in 1885; had 7 children--Robert S.; Sarah Malinda, died; Mary Lucretia, died; John A. F.; Wm. Lee, died; Nancy Bernetta; and Thomas Roach, died.

YARD: Job; born in Somersetshire, England; married to Frances Chorley, a native of the same place; a son, Thomas, was born in Stamford, Conn., on Dec 4, 1830; Thomas died in 1923 in Macomb; removed to the Macomb Mausoleum.

Emma Louise, was a daughter of Thomas Calvin and Louisa Yard; Thomas died in Macomb on Nov 1, 1923, aged 92y 10m 27d.

Post-Shippey Cemetery

Little remains of a small graveyard located in the SW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 32, Emmet township. The site is within privately owned property and is about a quarter of a mile from any public road. Broken stones for the individuals listed below were found under a large hickory tree located in pasture land. One large stone, apparently hand-carved from native rock, is not totally unreadable.
