Within the boundaries of McDonough County, Illinois are more than a hundred cemeteries and gravesites ranging in size from a single burial site to the expansize Oakwood Cemetery at Macomb. Within these cemeteries are the remains of an estimated 40,000 individuals who have died since the first settler arrived here over 150 years ago. Graves of countless others are scattered over the countryside of McDonough County; but, exact sites of many of these resting places are no longer known for various reasons. During the early days of this county, there were obviously no central burial grounds; thus, a pioneer family having the misfortune of losing one of it's members placed the deceased in a grave on a family homestead and erected a makeshift marker. A number of these family burial grounds later became public cemeteries, however, many of the grave sites soon became "lost". Crude wooden markers or a hand engraved stone soon succumbed to the elements and were never replaced; scores of families moved further west after staying in this area only a short time and the gravesites of their loved ones shortly became insignificant mounds of earth; a number of families passing through this vicinity suffered individual losses. A prime example of the latter is contained in a history of Bethel Township. In 1830, four children of an emigrant family died while enroute through McDonough County. They were buried near their places of death which occured about two miles southwest of Fandon. All traces of those graves have long been gone. During the summer of 1834, a widow lady died at her home in northern Tennessee Township. Her coffin of dressed walnut lumber was built by a local cabinet maker and she was buried in the timber near her home. Within a few years, no evidence remained to indicate the presence of her final resting place. A family who created an excellent farm from the prairies a few miles north of Macomb, maintained a fenced family burial site for several years. This cemetery contained the graves of about 12 former family members. During the early 1900's, the farm changed ownership. Shortly thereafter, the new owner removed all the stones, took down the fence, and this graveyard became part of a cornfield. These are only three of the countless incidents involving the total disappearance of burial sites. At this time, it is impossible to determine the locations of hundreds of individual's graves in this county.

Vandalism is responsible for the destruction of many grave stones. Countless markers have been partially or totally destroyed. Inscriptions have been obliterated by shotgun blasts, stones have been broken into dozens of pieces, and some markers have been entirely removed from their original locations.

While weather-wear and vandalism accounts for most of the destruction of individual tombstones, neglect is directly responsible for the eventual deterioration of graveyards. Several local cemeteries have had no protective fencing for a number of years and the grounds have become grazing land for livestock. Groundhogs and other burrowing animals have undermined large portions of various cemeteries. Some areas are nearly invisible because of massive growths of weeds and brush. Stones have fallen, broken, and become completely covered with soil and debris.

The overall conditions of our county cemeteries is a pathetic case. While some grounds are well maintained, or at least partially kept-up by various families, many have been totally forgotten. This situation is appalling and should never have come about. Apparently, lack of time, expense, and most of all regard has brought about the present-day poor conditions of many of our rural cemeteries.

Genealogical notes accompanying the various cemetery listings were prepared from a wide variety of sources including:
Local area history books and atlases; newspaper files; county,
state, and federal archives; family histories. These notes were
collected at random from readily available sources and little,
or no attempts were made to search for material for more complete genealogies. These notes are presented only for the pur-

poses of identification and/or clarification.

Every attempt has been made to present complete and accurate information. Readers will find errors and omissions. Others will not agree with portions of my findings; however, no information contained herein is based soley on assumption or guesswork. It must be remembered that this information has been prepared for use only as a tool for further research and that nothing must be taken as final and absolute.

The larger cemeteries contained in these volumes are accompanied by grave location charts. These charts in no way are intended to represent any professionally prepared plat or survey that may exist. Their preparation and presentation are

soley for general location purposes.

When copying inscriptions from grave markers, it is sometimes impossible to read some portions of the engraving. Names, dates, ages, etc. that were found to be unclear or totally missing are indicated by the use of question marks or dashes, i.e., SPICER, James T., infant son of ?J.B. & S.J.?; d. ----; age ----. The letters or numbers enclosed in parenthesis following the inscription, indicate general location as indicated on the accompanying chart.







"Cemeteries of McDonough County, Illinois"




# Portions of Bothel and Chalmers Townships



### ARCHER-BETHEL CEMETERY

Location: Bethel township,  $NE_{\frac{1}{4}}$ , section  $\theta$ ; one and a half miles south of Fandon.

Remarks: This cemetery was originally two acres in size and contained 114 lots. The grounds are well fenced; the area is regularly maintained and the overall condition is good. Many of the older stones have been broken and are badly weather-worn. This cemetery has also been known as Sullivan's Cemetery.

# Genealogical Notes - Archer-Bethel Cemetery

AMES: Melissa J., wife of Oliver; daughter of Isaac Lane; she was a sister to: Amanda, Lafayette, Alonzo, Thomas Benton, Isaac, Sarah Elizabeth, and Steven. After the death of her parents, the eldest 7 children were placed under temporary guardianship of Henry Venters in Schuyler Co.; Sarah & Steven Lane were placed under the guardianship of Alfred C. Wallace. The following obit appears in The Macomb Daily Journal, Apr 24, 1918: "Melissa J. Ames, daughter of Isaac and Mary (Jones) Lane, was born near Rushville, Schuyler Co., May 3, 1942. At the age of five, she was left an orphan and went to live with an uncle, John Lane, in Fulton Co., near Lewistown, with whom she lived until her marriage with Oliver P. Ames, March 1, 1866. They came to McDonough Co. in

AMES(cont'd): December, 1889, where they resided until the death of her husband, July 9, 1909. Since then she made her home with her daughter, Mrs. C. S. Wilson, in Bethel township, where she died April 19, 1918, aged 75 years, 11 months, and 14 days. She was the mother of three children: A lonzo E, died in infancy, and John P., who died in 1904, at the age of 28 years, leaving a wife and three small children. She leaves one daughter, Mrs. C. S. Wilson, seven grandchildren, and one great-grandchild."

ARCHER: Cavill (1785-1851) appears on the 1840 county tax list as # 656; he owned 80 acres in the E2 of the NE4 of section 8, Bethel Twp.; value of the land was \$5.00 per acre; he also owned \$250.00 worth of horses; \$190.00 in cattle; \$10.00 clocks & watches; \$100.00 wagons; and \$590.00 in other property; total taxes were \$7.70.

William F., husband of Pauline, appears on the 1840 county tax list as # 658; he owned no real estate; \$125.00 worth of horses; \$16.00 cattle; and \$50.00 in other property; taxes were \$ .96.

BAINTER: Elijah (1834-1907); his obit, in part, from the Macomb Daily By-Stander, Mar 16, 1907): "Elijah Bainter died at his home ten miles south of Macomb in Bethel township, Friday night at eight o'clock of pneumonia.... born January 15, 1834 in Fayette Co., Chio. He was a son of Mr. and Mrs. Jacob Bainter. In 1857, he was married to Christina Ferrow. In 1865, they came to Illinois, settling in Fulton Co., They came to McDonough Co. two years later and settled in Bethel township. He is survived by his wife and four sons and one daughter... Charles of Bethel township; Harvey and Clinton in Chalmers township! Nelson, at home; and Mrs. Clyde Black in Schuyler Co. He is also survived by 3 brothers and 1 sister."

BAKER: Mary, wife of Ephraim; b. in Ky.; maiden name was Goar; md. Mr. Baker in Ohio in 1835; died in Macomb; residence at the time of her death was 604 E. Murray St.

Ephraim; b. in Baltimore, Md.; married Mary Goar in Ross Co., Ohio in 1835; lived in Highland Co., Ohio before moved to this county in the 1860's. Mr. Baker served as a Pvt. during the Civil War with Co H, 73rd Ohio Inf. He and Mary had the following children: Levi, Charles, Lewis, William, John H., Mary Elizabeth (Mrs. J. W. Clark), Hannah, Sarah, and Net. While still residents of Ohio, the Clark family bought a 40 acre farm in section 17, Bethel township.

John (1812-1841) md. Abigail Dunsworth in this county on May 25, 1837; after Mr. Baker's death in 1841, his widow married Jacob S. Mathews on July 11, 1848.

Tina May (1891-1907) (Obit, in part, from The Macomb Daily Journal, Mar 1, 1907): "Fandon, the little inland village a few miles south of Colchester, is undergoing a siege of diphtheria and one death was already resulted from the dread disease. Miss Tina, the 16-year-old daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Ed Carnahan, was stricken with a slight attack of the desease Sunday. By Thursday it had developed into the most malignant form and although every method known to the medical profession was used to save live it was of no avail and at 11:50 o'clock Thursday night she passed away. The family is under quarantine..... The diphtheria first appeared in the Carnahan family about 2 weeks ago, their little 4-year-old daughter being afflicted with it. She recovered and the family believed that the disease had been stamped out.... Besides her parents, she leaves three brothers and one sister ....."

CLARK: Silas (b. 1845); b. in Ohio; moved to this county in 1863; lived on section 8, Bethel Twp.

Milton (1844-1862); enlisted in the army in Macomb on Aug 9, 1862; served as a private with Co A, 84th Ill Inf.; died at Nashville Dec 24, 1862.

Reuben R. (1832-1907)(Obit, in part, from The Macomb Daily By-Stander, Apr 27, 1907): "Ruben R. Clark was born in Ohio June 11, 1832; died at his home near Fandon...April 22nd, 1907. Deceased was married to Hannah Jane Black in 1851. To this union 12 children were born, four of these together with the wife and mother having preceded him.... He leaves eight children, a number of grandchildren, and a host of relatives...."

Daniel B. (1825-1886) (Obit, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Feb 18, 1886): "Daniel Clark, an old citizen of Fandon, died February 12th....He is survived by his wife; he was a veteran of the Civil War. He was born in Ross Co., Ohio where he lived until 1849, when he went to California and remained there for 1-2 years. He then returned to Ross Co. where he lived until the outbreak of the war. He served with Company A 1st Ohio Cavalry. Afterwards, he came to McDonough Co. where he has since resided. In March, 1868, he married Miss Eunice E. Robinson, who survives. They had I child, a daughter, Laura, who died in infancy...."

CLARK (cont'd): John P. (1813-1883)(Obit, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Oct 25, 1883): "John P. Clark died at his residence in Macomb on October 18th, aged 71 years. He was born at Ross County, Ohio on May 30, 1813, where he grew to manhood and where, in 1836, he married Mary Near, who was also a native of the same county. In 1852, they moved to Illinois settling in this county. For many years he lived in Bethel Twp. He was the father of 13 children, 7 sons and 6 daughters, allof whom survived along with his widow. All his sons and 1 daughter were present at his funeral, with the others being in distant states."

DAVIDSON: David C. (1848-1908), b. Halland Co., Sweden; son of Christopher & Hannah (Anderson) Davidson, natives of Sweden; David, one of two sons born to his parents, went to sea at age 21 years; sailed throughout the world for 4 years; then moved to this county after living for a year in Warren Co., Ill.; Mr. Davidson lived in Emmet and Bethel townships; he md. here May 17, 1872, to Nettie C. Allison; they had 3 children: Hattie J.; N annie E. (Mrs. John L. Curtis); and Selma E. (Mrs. Fred R. Clark).

DEPOY: Daniel (1805-1876); b. in Va.; moved to this county in 1865, from Ohio; lived on section 7, Bethel twp.

James (1833-1878) served during the Civil War with Co A 54th Ohio Inf.; he was wounded during that service.

DUNSWORTH: John M. (1820-1884); b. in Johnson Co., Ill; son of Thomas N. & Nancy (Hall) Dunsworth; lived in the State of Tennessee from 1823-1830, when they returned to Ill; moved to this county in 1832, and lived in Bethel Twp. His death notice, as follows, appears in The Macomb Journal, Jan 1, 1885): "John M. Dunsworth, one of the oldest settlers of McDonough Co., a resident of Bethel twp. died last Monday aged 64 years. He is survived by 7 children 5 sons and 2 daughters, all grown."

James H. (1808-1860); b. in Tenn., Jun 20, 1808; md. there to Jane Baker, a native of Tenn.; moved to this county in 1830 and settled on section 8, Bethel twp. They had the following children: Mary A., William M., John A., Andrew J., James N., Abbie J., Jefferson W., Dimmon B., and Chas W. Mr. Dunsworth appears on the 1840 county tax list as # 678; he owned 80 acres in section 12, Lamoine Twp.; residence was at that location; he also had \$160.00 worth of horses; \$133.00 in cattle; \$10.00 clocks & watches; \$70.00 wagons; and \$228.00 in other property; taxes were \$3.91.

Thos. M. (1790-1842); b. in Washington Co., Tenn.; son of Chas.; md. Nancy Hall, daughter of Sam'l Hall, and moved to Ill. in 1819; returned to Tenn. in 1823; moved to this co. in 1832; lived on section 17, Bethel Twp. A daughter, Susan (Mrs. Augustus Lillard), moved to this co. in 1830.

FERNOW: F. P., b. in Ohio; moved to this county from Ross Co., Ohio in 1864; farmed on section 8, Bethel Tup.

HATFIELD: Samuel, b. in Pa.; moved to this co. from Fayette Co., Pa. in 1868; farmed on section 5, Bethel Twp.

Elias, father of an infant that d. 1874, was a Fandon merchant; moved here from his native State of Pa. in 1870.

HENDRICKS: Fredrick; b. Pendleton Co., Ky., Aug 17, 1797; son of George & Catherine (Boggs) Hendricks; moved to Ohio in about 1814; Fredrick worked there as a brickmason; md. there to Nancy Underwood; moved to this co., 1838, & built the first brick house in Lamoine Twp. in 1840; he and Nancy had the following children: Jane (Mrs. Wm. Erving); William; James B.; Joseph; Sarah (Mrs. John Archer - moved to Page Co., Iowa); George; Harriet (Mrs. N. Gibson); John W.; Rebecca (Mrs. T. P. Price - moved to Washington Terr.); Benjamin F.; Mary (Mrs. Hugh Wear); Harvey; Charley. Mr. Hondricks appears on the 1840 county tax list as #722; residence was in section 11, Lamoine Twp.; he owned 160 acres in sections 11 & 12, Lamoine; also had \$200.00 worth of horses; \$52.00 cattle; \$10.00 clocks & watches; \$30.00 wagons; and \$272.00 in other property; total taxes were \$8.42.

Nancy, wife of Fredrick; daughter of Berryman and Jane (Humphreys) Underwood, natives of Wales; Nancy, b. in Va.; moved with her family to Champaign Co., Ohio. (Nancy's obit, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Nov 8, 1883): "Mrs. Nancy Hendricks died at the residence of her daughter, Mary I. Wear, in Lamoine Twp. on November 3rd, aged 84 years, 7 months. She was born in Greenbriar Co., Va. on Apr 2, 1799, and at the age of 11 years, moved to Champaign Co., Ohio where she was married to Fredrick Hendricks by whom she had 14 children, all of whom but one reached maturity. In the autumn of 1838, with her husband and children, she came to Lamoine Twp., McDonough Co., where her husband died in 1879. Since that time she has lived with her youngest son, C. H., and with her daughter, Mary Wear. Eight of her children survive hereone daughter resides in Iowa; another in Washington Terr., and a daughter and 4 sons in McDonough Co., and a son in Plymouth, Hancock Co...."

Goorgio & Josio wore children of James B. & Ellen E. (King) Hendricks; James B., the 3rd child of Fredrick & Nancy, was first married to H. A. Jackson in 1856; they had 2 children, Ellen & Eugene; Mrs. Hendricks died in 1860; James then md. in Oct., 1862, to Miss King, a dau of James & Mary (Thomas) King, natives of Ohio. James & Ellen had the following children: Flora Josie; Benjamin F.; Bessie; William; John; George; and Nora. James later farmed near Bardolph.

Carolino, wifo of Harvey; daughter of Alonzo & Jane (Wilson) Harrington.

HENDRICKS (cont'd): Harvey F., son of Fredrick & Nancy; b. in Lamoine Twp., this co., Mar 29, 1842; enlisted in the army in 1862; disabled because of illness and discharged at St. Louis on July 18, 1862; re-enlisted in 1864; engaged in a number of battles and was with Gon. Sherman on the "March to the Sea"; wounded in his right hand at Atlanta; returned to Quincy, Ill. & mustered out in July, 1865; returned to this area; then, in 1867, moved to Montana & mined there a few months; returned home for a few years; moved to Dakota in 1872 and was a government carpenter there for 8 years; came back to this county, 1880; bought a Lamoine Twp. farm; md. Oct., 1879, to Caroline Harrington; had 3 children: Fredrick, Edith, and Esther.

HORRELL: Robert L., b. in Adair Co., Ky.; son of James & Loah (Carson) Horrell; moved with the family to Scott Co., Ill. in 1827; then to this co., 1835; lived on section 4, Bethel Twp.; Robt. md. on Feb 16, 1854, to Mary A. Kinkado, a native of this co.; had 6 children: William Hugh; John D.; Harriet L.; Clara R. (Mrs. E. T. Riding); Mary E.; and Robt. Jesse. Robert served as a co. supervisor, tax collector, and road commissioner.

James L. (1795-1841), b. in Va.; son of Oliver C. & Mary (Tate) Horrell, natives of Va.; moved to Ill. in 1827. Mr. Horrell appears on the 1840 county tax list as # 584; he owned \$140.00 worth of horses; \$186.00 cattle; \$10.00 clocks & watches; \$15.00 carriages; and \$225.00 in other property; no real estate; taxes were \$2.88.

Loah (1799-1851), wife of James L.; daughter of James & Catherine (Nesbit) Carson, natives of N. Carolina.

James N. N. (1830-1890), son of James & Leah; b. in Scott Co., Ill.; md. Feb 18, 1856, to Clarissa Kinkade; had 5 children: Julia A.; Mary R.; Ida M.; Eliza L.; and Martha J.

Zolma (1893-1905)(Obit, in part, from The Macomb Weekly Sontinel, Jul 8, 1905): "Sunday afternoon the death angel visited the home of Mr. & Mrs. Wm. Horrell of near Colchester and removed their 12-year-old daughter, Zelma. She had been sick but a few days, her disease being appendicitis. Her death leaves a void in the heart of father, mether, sister, and brothers...."

HUNT: Thomas W., father of Sarah E., appears on the 1840 co. tax list as #659; he owned no real estate; had \$150.00 worth of horses; \$56.00 cattle; \$10.00 clocks & watches; \$30.00 wagens; and \$236.00 in other property; taxes were \$2.41. Thomas W. Hunt md. Mary Ann Archer in this co. on Nov 23, 1834.

- LANE: William B., husband of Mary Jane, served as a private with Co C 16th Ill Inf. from Dec 9, 1861 to Aug 10, 1862; he enlisted at Colchester. After the war, Mr. Lane ran a confectionery in Colchester.
- IAWYER: Samuel (1837-1913), a son of William; Wm., a native of Pa.; moved to Brown Co., Ill. in 1835; then to this co., 1836; lived in Tenn. Twp.; moved to Appaneose Co., Iowa in 1856, then to Wayne Co., Iowa, where Samuel's mother died; Wm. then moved to Union Co., Iowa and died there in 1883; Samuel was a brother to: Elizabeth (Mrs. Hoagland); Dedmarius (Mrs. Wm. Brooden); George J.; Catharine (Mrs. Ethan Jarvis); John W.; William; and Susan.
- LOVETT: John, husband of Louisa, later livedin Hire Twp., this county, and taught school in district 6 in the late 1870's.
- MASON: Benjamin B. (1860-1907), son of Burrow & Eveline (Hendrickson) Mason; Burrow, b. in 1814, in Cook Co., Tonn., a son of Adin & Mary (Warmact) Mason; Eveline, a native of Ohio. Benjamin was a brother to: Adin P.; Josse H.; Eliza J.; George W.; William E.; Samuel P.; and Etta R.
- MATHEWS: J. S. (1818-1865). Jacob S., b. in the State of Tenn.; son of Benjamin & Polly (Shoopman) Mathews, natives of Tenn.; Jacob owned and operated a grist-mill at Fandon for several years; on July 11, 1848, he md. Mrs. Abigail (Dunsworth) Baker, widow of John Baker; they had 4 children, included a son, James M., b. 1849. Benjamin, father of Jacob, was b. in 1792; md. in Tenn. to Polly Shoopman; moved to Cass Co., Ill. in 1813, and to this co. in 1829; lived in Bethol Twp.; Benj. died in 1878. Jacob appears as #731 on the 1840 county tax list; he owned no real estate; had \$35.00 in other property; taxes were \$.93. His father, Benj., appears as #651, on that list; he owned no real estate; had a total of \$323.00 worth of personal property with taxes of \$1.62.
- MOORE: Edwin, husband of Annio, served in the army during the Civil War; he enlisted at Colchester and served as a 1st Lt with Co C 16th Ill Inf.; he was later promoted to Major and served with the 21st Mo Inf.
- MYERS: Adam (1840-1924), b. in York Co., Pa., May 18, 1840; son of John & Elizabeth Myors, nativos of Pa.; John b. in 1821, and moved to Fulton Co., Ill. in 1853. Adam had the following brothers & sisters: Anna M. (Mrs. Henry Miller); Dina (Mrs. Sam'l Neighbours); Solomon; Elizabeth. After the death of Adam's methor, John md. Lydia C. Drossler; they had the following children: Jacob; Abraham. The 2nd Mrs. Nyers died and John md. 3rd to Mary Ann Vanco; they had 3 children: Lucy (Mrs. G. McLung); Alice (Mrs. Nathan Forkenraw); and

- MYERS (cont'd): Charles. Adam lived in Fulton Co. till 1859, then moved to Morgan Co. and farmed there till 1864; then moved to Cass Co., Ill. and lived there 2 years; returned to Fulton Co.; moved to this co., 1871; md. in April, 1865, to Mrs. Elizabeth (Horr) Batsen. They had the following children: Willota, Ida May, Isadere, James Martin, Robert Lee, John Emery, and Ella.
- RIDEN: David (1821-1893), b. in Pa.; moved to this co. in 1869; lived on section 33, Chalmers Twp.
- RIDING: Clara R. (1866-1892), wife of Elmor; daughter of Robert L. & Mary A. (Kinkade) Horrell.
  - RIGG: Howard (1915-1917)(Death notice, in part, from The Macomb Daily Journal, Apr 24, 1917): "The 2-year-old baby of Mr. & Mrs. George Rigg, residing southeast of Colchester, met with a fatal accident this morning when he fell into a tub of water and drowned...."
  - ROBINSON: John C. (1806-1888), b. in Maryland; son of James R. & Martha (McMullon) Robinson; md. in 1827, to Robecca Elliott; lived in Fayette Co., Pa. before moving to this co. in 1855; lived on section 9, Bethel Twp.; had the following children: Martha, Becka, Mary, Thomas, John, Samuel, Robert, Benjamin, and Nancy.
    - Jamos A. (1832-1923), b. in Pa.; moved to this co. from Adams Co., Ill. in 1862; lived on section 7, Bothel Twp.
    - Samuel D. E. (1831-1886) (Obit, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Sep 16, 1886): "Samuel E. Robinson died at his home in Bothel Twp. on September 10th, aged 55 years 10 months. He was born in Fayette Co., Pa., where he grew to manhood. When he was 30 years old he married Miss Hannah L. Anderson, who with 2 sons, aged 10 years and 10 years, survive. In 1864, they moved to Bothel Twp. He was a member of the Baptist Church..."
- STUMP: John (1827-1905), b. in Pa.; moved to this co. from York Co., Pa. in 1865; lived on section 17, Bethel Twp.
- SULLIVAN: Josoph (1826-1894) moved to this co. from his native Pa. in about 1835; married in this co. on Sep 27, 1848, to Mary Ponrose. They lived on section 4, Bethel Twp.
- THOMPSON: William Vance (1833-1911); b. Butler Co., Pa.; md. to Mary Ann Griffin in 1871; had 13 children: John Ora; Dolly; Ada May; Thomas A.; Robert; Grover; Theodore (moved to Oregon); Sylvia; Sadio (moved to Ky.); James Willard; Frod; Charles; Edward; and Cora. The family lived in Bethel Twp. William's sister, Martha, married John Kerr.

VORHES: John (1822-1878), b. in Ohio & moved here from there in 1855; farmed on section 32, Chalmers Twp. He served in the army from Aug 11, 1862 to Jun 8, 1865. Another Vorhes, Goorge R., onlisted at the time and place as John; Goo. died while in service.

WEAR: Andrew (1821-1909), sonof Hugh E. & Sarah (Duncomb) Wear; Hugh, Sr., b. in Washington Co., Tenn. in 1789; the family moved to Lameine Twp., this co., in 1835; Andrew's parents, along with other members of the family, are buried at Scott Cometery. Mr. Wear appears on the 1840 county tax list as #915; he owned \$50.00 worth of horses; \$20.00 cattle; and \$11.00 in other property; taxes were \$ .41.

James M. (1845-1937) enlisted in the army in Lameine Twp. on Dec 16, 1863; transferred to the 33rd Ill Inf.; discharged New 24, 1865.

John B. (1816-1900) appears on the 1840 county tax list as # 913; he owned \$50.00 worth of horses; \$39.00 cattle; and \$12.00 in other property; taxes were \$ .51.

WILSON: Samuel (Sr); son of John & Jane (McComsoy) Wilson; b. Mar 17, 1817, at Mochanicsburg, Ohio; John, b. in 1781, in Greenbriar Co., Va.; moved to Ohio & md. there on Dec 20, 1809, to Miss McComsey; Jane was b. in Harrodsburg, Ky. in 1787. John & Jano Wilson had 7 children: Mclissa, Margaret, Samuel, John, Eli, Jane, and Mary Ann. The family moved to this co. in 1835, settling in Bethel Twp.; John, father of Sam'l, died in 1843; Jane, died in 1861. Samuel md. Susan Edmonston in this co., Nov 30, 1837. They had 10 children: Mary Jane, Annie, William, Eli, Zachary T., Nicholas E., James E., Samuel, Laura, Lizzie, and Edwin M. Samuel, Sr. was county assessor in the 1840's. In 1850, Samuel and - Susan and their children were living in Bainbridge Twp., Schuylor Co. in the James Edmonston household. Samil Wilson appears on the 1840 county tax list as # 630; he owned \$75.00 worth of horses; \$20.00 cattle; and \$100.00 in other propertyp no real estate; taxes were \$ .98. At the beginning of the Civil War, Mr. Wilson formed a company of mon and was later made Lt. Col. in the 16th Ill Inf.; he was reloased from active duty on Nov 14, 1862, because of ill hoalth; he was elected county sheriff in 1866; in 1881, Mr. Wilson moved to Pooria, where he was employed by the federal govornment.

Susan (1822-1884), wife of Sam'l, was a daughter of James & Polly Edmonston; her father was born in N.C. and in 1850 was farming in Bainbridge Twp., Schuyler Co.; her methor, Polly, was born in S.C. in about 1792; Susan had a sister, Polly G., born in Iowa in about 1827, and a brother, Joel, born in Iowa in 1830. Susan's obit appeared in The Macomb Journal, Jun 12, 1884. It reads, in part, as follows:

WILSON (contid): "Mrs. Samil Wilson died at her home in Fandon last Saturday, June 6, 1884, aged 63 years. She was born Susan Edmenston in Dubois County, Indiana in 1822. Who she was 8 years old she came with her parents to this county and settled in Middletown (new Fandon). Before she was 15 years old, she married Samuel Wilson who survives. Most of her life has been spent in the area where she died except for a few years residence in Kansas and two in Macomb. She was the mother of 10 children, 7 sens and 3 daughters......Her husband and 3 sens served in the Civil War...."

## BAPTIST CEMETERY

Location: Bethel township;  $SW_{\underline{a}}^{\underline{1}}$ , section 10. Two miles southeast of Fandon.

Romarks: Very little remains of this cometery at the present time. The general area has been used as a pasture for a number of years and the perimeter of the original grounds cannot now be established. The few remaining stones that were located during this 1975 survey were broken and scattered over about a half-acre of ground. A Baptist Church was organized at this location in November, 1831, and a log building was erected in about 1832. Two and one-half acres were set aside for church and cometery grounds. This tract is situated about a quarter-mile east of a public road and is now on privately owned property. In about 1875, the organization rebuilt their church about a mile and half west of this original site.

## BOWLIN-WAYLAND GRAVES

Neighborhood sources state that this area was once known as the Riden Graveyard. In 1871, W. Wayland was indicated as the owner of the property on which these stones now stand. These three graves lie in the NW2 of section 34, Chalmers township.


WAYLAND: Wesley moved to this county in about 1832 and lived on section 34, Chalmers township. He moved here from Carroll Co., Ky. He appears on the 1840 county tax list as # 579. He owned no real estate at that time; had \$230.00 worth of horses; \$20.00 cattle; \$100.00 carriages; \$190.00 worth of other property; and had \$100.00 cash loaned out. His total taxes were \$3.20. On page 60, Clarkes, "History of McDonough County", 1878, the following item appears: "In the year 1836, Wesley Wayland came before the County Commissioner's Court and stated that he had given a certificate of freedom to a certain negro woman whom he had brought with him from Kentucky a few years provious, for the purpose of acting as nurse to his invalid wife. We believe Mr. Wayland had been taxed on this species of property since 1832, and had reached the conclusion it didn't pay."

## GIBSON CEMETERY

## Genealogical Notes - Gibson Cemetery

- BARRITT: John owned a farm a mile north of Fandon.
- CLARK: Thomas farmed on section 1, Lamoine Twp.; he was a native of Ohio and moved to this county from Adair Co., Mo. in 1863.
- COGHILL: Elza (Death notice, in part, from The Macomb By-Stander, Apr 13, 1898): "Elza Coghill, an old resident of Fandon neighborhood, died at his home last evening at 8 o'clock of dropsy and rheumatism...."
- COON: Jacob farmed in Chalmers Twp., about a half-mile north of Fandon.
- FRIEND: Thomas J. onlisted in the army at Middletown (Fandon) on Nov 7, 1861; served as a private with Co I llth Ill Cav. till being discharged on Jan 8, 1863.
- John (1787-1869), credited by local historians as GIBSON: the first sottler of Bethel Twp., arrived here in 1829; he and family settled on section 2, Bethel; John was born in N.C. Mr. Gibson was apparently a veteran of the War of 1812; on page 391, Clarke's, History of McDonough County, the following is quoted, in part: "....John Gibson, who lived near Middlotown. He was a strong Democrat, but had formerly boon a soldier under Gon'l Harrison, and had the utmost respect for the old warrior. Though he would not voto for his old general, he allowed no one to speak evil of him in his presence, and would get fighting mad if any one dared to do so........... John Gibson appears on the 1840 county tax list as # 697; he owned no real estato; had \$145.00 worth of horses; \$157.00 cattle; \$10.00 clocks & watches; \$50.00 wagons; \$309.00 in other property; his taxes were \$3.36. The first marriage in Bethel township was that of Thos. Driskill & Miss Sarah Gibson, a daughter of John & Nancy Gibson. The first birth in Bothel was a son, Joseph, to Mr. & Mrs. John Gibson, in 1832.

Amos (1818-1875) appears on the 1840 county tax list as #700; he had no real estate; \$65.00 worth of horses; and his total taxes were \$ .33. Appearing immediately before Amos on that tax list, as #699, was John G. Gibson, who owned \$126.00 in personal property. Amos Gibson and Miss Robecca Dickason were md. in this county on Sep 29, 1848.

- GIBSON (cont'd): Samuol (1821-1897) and Elizabeth Huston were md. in this co. on Mar 2, 1843.
  - Nancy (1806-1860), 2nd wife of John Gibson, was a native of Ky.; the foderal census for 1860, taken in Bethel Twp. during June/July of that year, indicates the John Gibson household consisting of the following members: John; Nancy (ago 54); Nancy (ago 16); Allen (16); & Aguilla (14).
- GRISWOLD: Lyman (Death notice, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Doc 29, 1887): "Lyman Griswold died recently in Colchester Twp., aged 71 years. He was born in New York in 1816 and came to this county in 1863."
- HILLS: Sarah, wife of John; maiden name was Massingale; she and John Hills were md. in this co. on Mar 26, 1839.
- HORRELL: L. P. (1819-1873), b. in Adair Co., Ky., Sop 16, 1819; moved with parents to Ill. in the early 1820's; lived for awhile in Morgan Co. L. P. was a son of Chas. & Elizabeth Horrell; L. P. md. Annis R. Beadles on Sop 19, 1850, and lived about 8 miles from Jacksonville, Ill. till about 1864, when he moved to this co. and bought a farm in Chalmers Twp.
- JOHNSON: Mary E. (Obit, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Nov 13, 1884): "Mary, wife of Harry Johnson, died at the residence of her mether, Mrs. A. R. Horrell, of near Colchester, on November 10th, aged about 24 years. She married Harry Johnson, the stonemason, about 6 years age. They came to Macomb to reside. She was a sister of Dr. Chas. Horrell of Colchester."
- MINNER: Samuel (1810-1883) farmed on section 31, Chalmers Twp.; he was a native of Delaware and moved to this co. in 1850, from Ohio.
- MONK: Walter (Doath notice, in part, from The Macomb Journal, Mar 10, 1887): "Walter Munk, of Lameine, died last Thursday and was buried in the Gibson burying ground, aged 22 years. He is survived by a wife and one child."
- MYERS: Robert (1820-1886); b. Allegheny Co., Pa., Mar 2, 1820; son of Eli & Ann (Porter) Myers; the family moved to Pickaway Co., Ohio in about 1823; Eli & Ann died in that county; Robt. then lived with an uncle, Wm. Porter, till his marriage in 1846, to Mary Ann Hollowell; moved to Adams Co., Ill. in 1849; and to this co. in 1850; lived in Tenn. Twp.; Robt. & Mary's children included: Sarah; Julia; John; Ann Elizabeth (Mrs. Reuben Strader); Mary Jano (Mrs. Cassius M. Strader); and Wm. Kenton.

Mary Ann (1819-1888), wife of Robt.; daughter of John and Elizabeth (Johnson) Hollowell.

- RIGGS: Androw (Doath notice, The Macomb Journal, Apr 28, 1887): "Jackson Riggs, for over 20 years, a resident of the vicinity of Colchester, died Sunday at his home, 3 miles southeast of town, aged 60 years."
- SPIVA: The William Spiva family appears on the 1850 federal consus for Schuyler Co., Ill.; they were living in Oregon Twp.; the household consisted of the following persons: William, b. in N.C., farmer; Robecca, age 34, b. N.C.; and 7 children, all b. in Ill., as follows: John S., 14; Susan J., 12; Francis M., 10; Wm. J., 9; Andrew N., 7; James H., 5; and Elizabeth, 3.
- STRADER: John (1817-1863) md. Caroline Tracey in this co. on Mar 7, 1849. Both John & Caroline, natives of Ohio.
  - John M. (a son of John & Caroline) md. Allie Welch; he was born near Macomb on May 29, 1856, and farmed in Chalmers Twp.; John M. d. in 1922, in Macomb.
- SULLIVAN: Mary, wife of W. R.; born & died in this county.
- TUGGLE: John (1781-1857) lived in the State of Va. and in Morgan Co., Ill. before coming to this co. in about 1836; his wife was the former Elizabeth Genneny. A son, John, Jr., was b. in Va. in 1817.

## MILER GRAVE

Located on the west side of a gravel road leading north from Fandon, is a single gravestone; that of Martha Miler. This site is about a half-mile north of town.

Mrs. Miler (name also spelled as MYLER) was the mother of Mary (Myler) Stevens, wife of William D. Stevens, who came to this area in about 1839. William & Mary were md. in Indiana in about 1826 and lived in Harrison Co., Ind. till the late-1830's, when they moved to Schuyler Co., Ill. They lived there about a year, then moved to Chalmers Twp. in this county. They had the following children: Emily; Amanda; Lewain; Jasper Newton; Henry H.; Charles A.; Thomas; and Mary. Mary (Myler) Stevens, and other members of this family are buried in a family cemetery about two miles southeast of Colchester.

## STRADER-NANKIVEL CEMETERY

Location: Chalmers township; NW\(\frac{1}{4}\) section 34; 5 miles south of Macomb on county road 16, then 3 miles west on county road 22; or, 2 miles northeast of Fandon on county road 22. The grounds are located about \(\frac{1}{4}\) mile north of county road 22 on a ridge between two deep gullies. This cometory is on privately owned property and no type of roadway least directly to this graveyard.

Romarks: This family comotery is located in semi-heavy timber and the grounds are covered with woods and brush. The old wire fencing is nearly gone from all sides. A large number of the stones are yet standing, however, most are badly weather-worn. Soveral stones were located under 4-5 inches of grass, leaves, and dirt. There are an estimated 30 field stones on which any engraving that may have been placed is not totally unreadable.

# Genealogical Notes Strader-Nankivel Cemetery

MC CORMICK: John (1789-1880); b. Carroll Co., Md.; moved to Fayette Co., Ky. in about 1793; later lived in Sullivan Co., Ky.; moved to this county in about 1835; married first to Nancy Cox and had 7 children. After his first wife died in 1838, John married Parthena Ball in this county on Dec 22, 1838. John & Parthena were original members of the Antioch Church of Regular Baptists organized at Fandon in 1841. The following is quoted, in part, from page 533, Clarke's, History of McDonough Co. (1878): "John McCormick, one of (the church's) constituents, came from Kentucky in 1835 or 1836, and has been for many years living with his second wife, both estimable people, and the old gentleman is now largely over eighty, but is able to attend to his own business...." Mr. McCormick appears on the 1840 county tax list as # 581; he owned no real estate; had \$70.00 worth of horses; \$92.00 cattle; \$50.00 carriages; and \$282.00 worth of other property; total taxes were \$2.47.

Theodore B., father of William D. (1844-1848), was a son of John & Nancy (Cox) McCormick; T.B. was born in Ky. & md. in this county to Emily Stevens on Dec 28, 1843; Emily was a daughter of Wm. Stevens; their children included: William D.; Nancy J.; and Florence L. Mr. & Mrs. McCormick are buried at the Stevens Cemetery south of Colchester.

MITCHELL: Theophilus L.; b. in Harrison Co., Ky.; moved to this county in about 1841; farmed in Bethel Twp.

NANKIVEL: John appears on the 1840 county tax list as #586; he owned no real estate; had \$100.00 worth of horses; \$20.00 cattle; \$80.00 cash loaned out; and \$90.00 worth of other property; taxes were \$1.45. The Nankivel's moved to this county from Maryland in about 1838; farmed on section 3, Bethel Twp.

Amelia; according to court records was born in Maryland & moved to this county with her parents in the 1830's. Sho never md.; died at age 49y.

William H.; b. in Md.; son of John & Mary; moved here with parents in about 1838.

STRADER: Simeon moved to this county from Ohio in about 1855; he and his family lived on section 34. Chalmers Twp. where Mr. Strader farmed and worked as a blacksmith.

SULLIVAN: Jeremiah moved to this co. in about 1835 from Washington Co., Pa.; a son, Jeremiah, Jr., was born in that county in 1817. Jeremiah, Sr. appears on the 1840

SULLIVAN (cont'd); county tax list as # 375; he ewned no real estate; had \$40.00 worth of horses; \$8.00 in clocks & watches; \$15.00 wagons; and \$40.00 worth of other property; taxes were \$ .52. Joremiah, Jr. appears as # 376 on that list; Jeremiah, Sr. was identified on the tax list as "white headed".

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## WAYMACK CEMETERY

Location: Bethel township,  $NW_{\frac{1}{4}}^{\frac{1}{2}}$  section 9. One and one-half miles south-southeast of Fandon; or, one-fourth mile east of Bethel Church.

Remarks; This small family burial ground is located on privately owned property. It is unfenced, however, the area is non-pasture land, and the stones are in relatively good condition. The name, Waymack, is noted to be spelled on the various stones here as "Warmack and/or Wormack.

## Genealogical Notes - Waymack Cemetery

DARK: Christina was a daughter of Buckner Waymack; b. in Va.; she was the 2nd wife of Sam'l L. Dark; they had 10 children including Andrew Jackson Dark, b. in this county in 1850; Sam'l died in 1899 at age 93y. Mr. Dark lived several years in Brooklyn, Schuyler Co. He became a Baptist preacher in 1832.

WAYMACK: Jacob appears on the 1850 federal consus for Brooklyn Twp., Schuyler Co., Ill.; he was b. in the State of Tenn.; farmed, and owned \$800.00 worth of real estate; his wife, Nancy, was al so b. in Tenn.; their 4 children, listed on that report, were b. in Ill.; they were: Aden, age 7; Rosetta, 5; Mary E., 4; and Buckner, 2. Jacob was a son of Buckner & Nancy Waymack. Jacob's father died in Schuyler Co. in about 1856. On Mar 5, 1840, Jacob md. Nancy Mason in this county. Daughter, Rosette, b. Aug 12, 1844, md. Nimrod Robinson; she died in Macomb on Jan 29, 1922; buried at Cox Cemetery in Schuyler Co.
